

Riding Holidays in Pembrokeshire.

Itinerary



If you are seeking a break from the stresses of everyday life within stunning scenery then Pembrokeshire is perfect for a relaxing horse riding holiday. Pembrokeshire is blessed with beautiful countryside scattered with paths, bridle ways and quiet roads perfect for hacking out.

Friday

Arrive in the afternoon today and settle in to your accommodation. This afternoon you may like to travel to Pembrokeshire Coast National Park. This National Park offers a wealth of wildlife and some of the most stunning scenery in Britain. The park is Britain's only truly coastal National Park boasting a spectacular landscape around Wales' south-western shore. This evening enjoy a cooked meal at your accommodation.



Saturday

Today after breakfast you will be stepping back in time and exploring routes ridden by medieval knights, drover's paths and smugglers trails. You will be traversing part of the Medieval Knights Way. This route was often ridden by knights who were riding to St. Davids on their pilgrimage. Lunch will be taken at a local farm or country Inn where fresh local produce is used. After lunch you will continue your ride past castle ruins enjoying dramatic scenery in the woodland and open countryside.



Sunday

Today you will be riding through woodlands, ancient forests and over open countryside, discovering small pretty villages that took their names from Norman knights nearly a thousand years ago. Each route has been carefully researched so that you can experience a variety of terrains and travel at various paces. Today lunch will be taken at a local farm or country Inn. This afternoon you will continue your ride through woodland and open countryside. You may, if you wish, groom and tack up your own horse each day.



Monday

Today after a fully cooked breakfast you will be riding on the beach. This exhilarating ride is guaranteed to blow the cobwebs away! On the beach you will be pounding the surf with your horses. After the beach ride it is unfortunately time to depart but before you leave you may like to visit the quaint village of Templeton. Templeton has a single main street which is fronted by houses; a classical example of planning from the Middle Ages. The fields surrounding the village still show the narrow strips of land from the time of medieval agriculture.



For non riders Pembrokeshire has plenty to offer including golfing, walking, fishing, sightseeing and shopping, together with a host of other activities and attractions.

This break can be run from Friday – Monday or Tuesday – Thursday. We also offer week-long holidays.

This riding break is only suitable for experienced adult riders.
